

WINE BIKE







The Wine Bike makes serving your favorite burgundy or bubbly utterly memorable. The pedal-driven hospitality device is equipped with a five-blade propeller that holds up to forty-five stem glasses. The propeller is 9' high and rotates while the Wine Bike (also called the Trike) is ridden by a single artist/server who is included in a standard 2-hour contract. A great attention getter and a wonderful backdrop for guest photos.

FAQS

- 1. What are the dimensions? The Wine Bike is 6' long x 39" wide x 11' tall.
- 2. How much room is required for operation? A 4' aisle is recommended.
- **3. What surface is required for operation?** The Wine Bike can be driven on most level surfaces. Carpet, dance floor, asphalt, concrete, pavers are all acceptable. Movement on grass is also possible.
- **4.** How fast does the Wine Bike move? While it can travel at the pace of a quick walk it is typically driven very slowly.
- **5.** How do you manage crowded spaces? We are accustomed to performing in very crowded spaces. The turning mechanism allows for the Trike to rotate on a dime.
- 6. Does the client need to provide beverages, ice, or glasses? Yes, the client must provide all three. Stemmed wine glasses must have a base of at least 2" in diameter with a stem no thicker than ½". We also provide an onboard ice bucket large enough to chill 6 wine bottles.
- **7. Do we require any local crew?** Yes, local support staff is required to resupply and manage glasses and beverages.
- **8.** Can the Wine Bike be used to serve things other than beverages? Yes, the propeller blades can be used to serve a myriad of goodies, such as cotton candy, bags of popcorn or buckets of nuts, etc...
- **9. How is the Wine Bike transported?** For events within 500 miles of Las Vegas or Orlando, the Wine Bike is brought in by truck. Distances greater than 500 miles require the apparatus to be shipped via our freight service in a 72" x 72" x 24" wheeled crate. The client must support receipt and local transportation of crate.
- 10.How long does it take to build and to strike? If trucked in, it can be tipped back and rolled through a set of double doors and ready to go in minutes. To strike all that is required is to tip it back and roll out the door. If shipped in its crate, it will need to be assembled on site. The Trike can be built in under two hours.
- 11.Does the Wine Bike provide any branding opportunities? Yes, 36" diameter wheel covers can added and used for placement of client logos and artwork, examples of this can be seen on Page 1.
